□ Formal Sectors

- Formal economy is the sector where all jobs are encompasses with normal hours and regular wages, those are also recognized as income sources because income taxes are paid.
- Under the control of Government
- □ Its contribution is taken care of GDP growth, national employment statistics and in national accounting system.

□ Informal Sectors

- Informal economy is the sector where working hours and waters are not recognized as income sources because income taxes are not paid.
- Beyond the control of Government
- □ Its contribution is taken care of GDP growth, national employment statistics and in national accounting system.






Formal Economy Mode of transportation of raw materials








Labour Distribution and Male-Female Ratio of Informal Industries




Mode of Transport of Raw Materials






Waste disposal site
